## Nancy Fleury, Associate Head of Lower School:

## Lower School practices used to support positive student behavior for optimal learning

"Positive Behavior Expectations" is a resource guide that lives on the school website. It is a resource that parents can access any time. It outlines behavioral expectations using the points of the moral compass.

- Important for parents to know so things can be reinforced at home.
- Important to understand the link between academic learning and social/emotional learning. Responsive classroom is an approach to teaching that the lower school has embraced as a roadmap to ensure consistency when they work with our young children.
- Learning for Living is a spiral that is built upon at each grade level. Themes are revisited
  each year using age-appropriate literature and activities. The money raised at the book
  sales helps to fund the purchase of the anchor book that supports the theme. Also helps
  the faculty and staff when our children have a blip- they can refer back to the principles
  and activities the child has been taught.

## Responsive Classroom Approach

- Evidence based.
- Provides consistency and continuity.
- Supports a strong and safe school community.
- Promotes a positive community and developmentally responsive teaching.

## Guidance and Discipline of Students

When children feel safe they are more likely to take academic risks

When there is a misstep there is a 4 tier approach

1- reminding language, redirecting, reinforcing

- 2- Invited to rest and return or take a break in areas of the classroom
- 3- Buddy teacher Intervention- sometimes just a change of environment for a few minutes helps
- 4- Admin or Dr. Dan- may schedule problem solving conferences

Logical consequences allow children to make a connection between their misstep and the consequence that follows. Gives the child a sense of ownership of their school environment and their role in it.

Thank you for your support at home. When there are repeat missteps, Nancy or Malika and/or Dr. Dan are resources for you.

Homeroom teachers are the first point of contact. They are happy to support and partner with you to help resolve issues.

Never hesitate to reach out with your questions and concerns.

When severe behavior situations arise, there is no magic formula and the situations are assessed on a case-by-case basis.

Safety is number one. A misstep that impacts the safety of other children is addressed swiftly. Learning must not be disrupted by any child.

There are supports in place when a child has a challenge-

Recurring situations require consequences that are aligned with the misstep. With young children they are thorough and they spend a good amount if time peeling back the layers. Transparency is desired but confidentiality and privacy of the children must be respected for ethical and legal reasons.

The admin and staff regroup every year to determine the classroom balance as they assign classes for the next school year.
