Upper School Update:

Merritt Livermore, Head of Upper School- Glad to have chance to address concern about social media snapchat post investigation issue yesterday targeting the Gerstell community; The concern was not physically at McDonogh School; From the investigation yesterday, it was determined that the McDonogh student in question did not create the snapchat and was not a threat to McDonogh or any other school. An investigation and debriefing will continue about how the snapchat was manipulated and reposted. McDonogh is trying to help protect all students. We hope to follow-up after the investigation is closed, so that we can help the students understand the lessons that can be learned and the legal ramifications of this type of behavior.

Q: What are the security measures in place if something should happen at McDonogh? A: Parents and students would get an alert from Nina Sinnott from communications. The Security number is (443) 544-7111. Please add it to your address book.

Q: Parent asked about security of Boarders

A: Merritt stated that security has always been there, but looking at using technology to help with security; Asked students to keep blinds "up" on windows when not needing them; now asked to have doors open during study hall instead of always closed; sign out procedure is stronger

Q: Parent asked about update on Boarders

A: Merritt will relay concerns. There are discussions about the boarding program and more information will come out; we are starting to focus on boy culture/ video games/ athletics and how to help instruct the kids; "The Mask You Live In" is a movie that maybe incorporated into

wellness program. The Mask You Live In follows boys and young men as they struggle to stay true to themselves while negotiating America's narrow definition of masculinity. Research shows that compared to girls, boys in the U.S. are more likely to be diagnosed with a behavior disorder, prescribed stimulant medications, and fail out of school.

Q: Will you speak about the responsible adults in the dorms?

A: My understanding is that there was no information brought to an adult. Hindsight is 20/20. We are looking at all of the roles. We are asking how we can be more vigilant across the board with accountability programming.

Q: Is there an opportunity for snow/ski/snowboard club on friday nights in Jan and Feb? A: We will need to look into the legal concerns and what is needed from teachers.

Guest Speaker:

Andy Hilgartner, Senior Class Dean: This is his 11th year as class dean. Senior year is important and busy with applications for college, teachers still expecting classwork, etc; Senior class dinner happened in February with a young alumni program and hypnotist; we just had April fools the other day; All Deans wear a lot of hats: we provide the greatest possible experience for the students; we are a disciplinarian, liaison, counselor, etc; the class size increased to 152 students this year, yet still need to continue to make it feel "small", it can be a challenge and opportunity; May 8th last day of class; May 10th Senior class transition day with speakers: College residential life speaker and Jerry Love talking about legal concerns/senior week/ parties at college, sexual consent; Keith Wilford from senior class retreat in August will talk about legacy, where headed/ mission in life, and may have a panel of young alumni; May 11th headmaster day; senior projects start May 12th (internships, travel, service); then graduation with all staff, coaches, teachers, Deans to congratulate the students.
